

The Council of Civic Organizations of Brandywine Hundred (CCOBH) is a nonpartisan civic umbrella organization representing the concerns of 140 civic organizations and neighborhoods in Brandywine Hundred. It is the oldest and largest organization of its type in Delaware.

### Our History:

CCOBH was originally formed in 1928 as the Blue Rock Mens Club. Reformed in 1938 as the Brandywine Hundred Civic Association. In 1950 the name was changed to the current Council of Civic Organizations of Brandywine Hundred. In 1967 the CCOBH was incorporated as a 501(c)(4) nonprofit organization.

# CCOBH's Primary Areas of Focus for the Brandywine Hundred are:

- to consider quality-of-life issues and to promote better standards of living;
- to promote, encourage, and/or assist worthwhile movements that will benefit the residents;
- to contribute in every way possible to an atmosphere of tolerance, friendliness, and a positive community spirit;
- to promote civic improvements and public policy ordinances and legislation that benefit citizens throughout New Castle County and the State of Delaware.

- Environmental Issues (Air & Water Issues; Toxic Emissions near residents);
- Historic & Heritage Preservation
